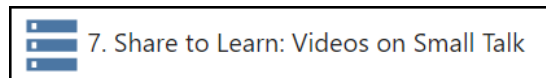


## Database

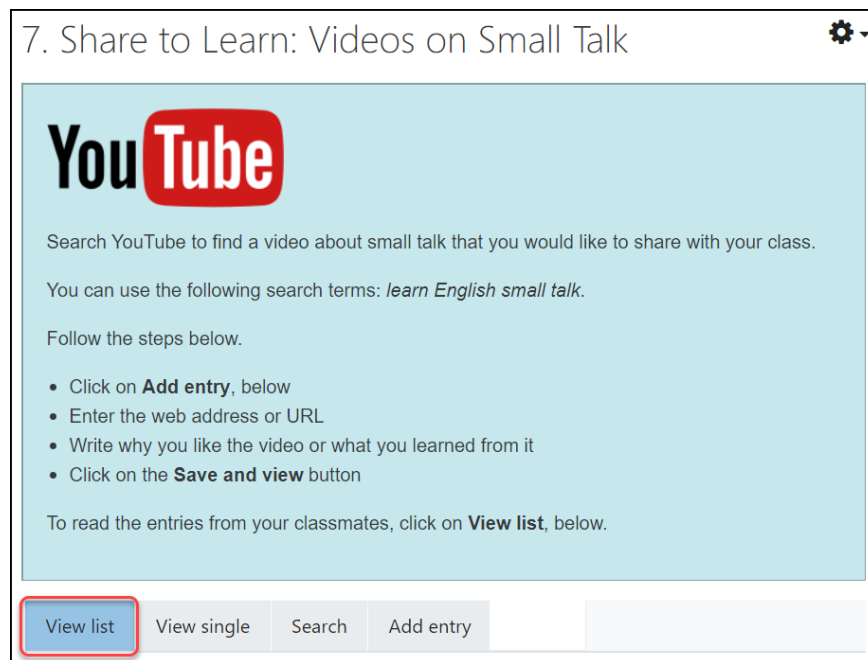
The *Database* feature allows you to share resources and research.

## Viewing a Database Resource

You may view the activity and resources in a *Database* activity. You can also add your own entries. When first opened, the activity defaults to the *View list* tab and provides instructions and prompts.

## Adding an Entry

1. Click on the *Add entry* tab, click inside each textbox and respond to the question or prompt, and click on the *Save and view* button when finished.

## Viewing an Entry or Entries

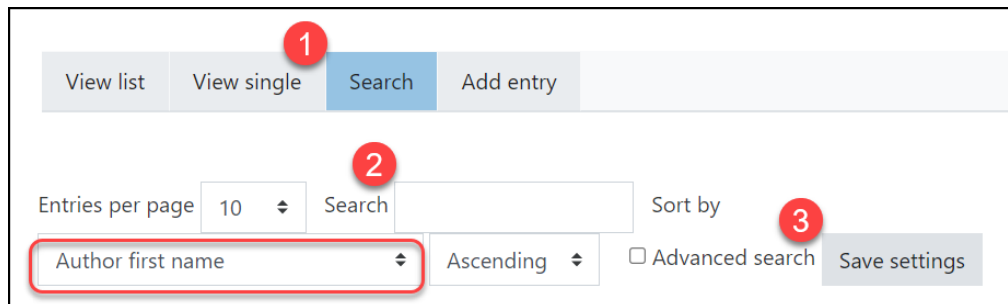
With more than one entry in the *Database*, each entry can be viewed individually in the *View single* tab by choosing an entry number.

## Searching Database Entries

You can search a *Database*.

1. Click on the *Search tab*.
2. Type your search filter keyword into the appropriate textbox. In this example, the *Author first name* textbox is used to find your own entries.
3. Click the *Save settings* button.
