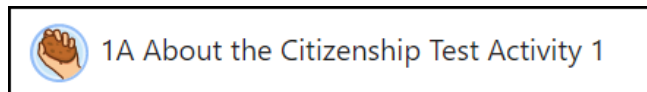


## Hot Potatoes

### Overview

*Hot Potatoes* is a fun and interactive way to review the text in a reading, read and answer comprehension questions and practice vocabulary. It helps you understand how sentences and paragraphs are connected. These activities can be attempted multiple times.

1. Click on a *Hot Potatoes* activity link.



2. Read the instructions, and choose the first segment of the sentence (in this case, either A or B). Some answers are numbered to show they are the beginning of a new paragraph.
