SCORM

Overview

A SCORM is a type of ready-made, interactive content that is aligned with a curriculum. Using SCORMs makes it easy for instructors to use content without having to develop content themselves. SCORM learning objects provide immediate feedback to learners, and the grades from completing the activities are automatically sent to the gradebook.

As several educational development software companies publish digital learning activities in *SCORM format*, there are a variety of *SCORM* activities in your courses. Each *SCORM* activity may have a unique composition of activities. Popular formats at both the lower and higher learner levels will be shown here.

SCORM Listening Activity (CLB 1-2) – Instructor Experience

1. On the course page, click on a SCORM link.



The SCORM activity appears.

2. You can use the *Actions Menu* on the top right corner to edit the activity settings, view activity permissions or access activity logs.




a. Clicking on the *Edit settings* link will take you to the *General* page where you can configure several activity settings. It is advised that *instructors do not change the settings* for the *SCORM* activities.

- b. The *Permissions* link shows which roles have rights to do specific functions.
- c. The *Logs* link shows a detailed view of the online work in the course.
- 3. To see the learners' view of the SCORM, click on the Enter button.

The first slide of the *SCORM* activity appears. Usually, instructions are read out loud to the learner. In this case, they say, "*Play the video.*"

In this *SCORM* activity, there are several navigation options. There is a transcript of the video, available by clicking on the *Show Transcript* button. To hide the transcript, click on the *Hide Transcript* button. After viewing the video, the learner may progress by clicking the *Next* button.



Learners listen to and/or read the instructions before attempting the task.

After the series of tasks is complete, the final slide appears. To return to the course, learners must take one final step and click on the *Exit activity* link.




CLB1-2 SCORM Activity Types



1. On the course page, click on a SCORM link.






